Sheary Charitable Trust Donation Exceeds \$18,000



In July, Brooks Gronlund, president of the Green Dragon Foundation, announced the foundation received a grant in the amount of \$18,639 from the Edna M. Sheary Charitable Trust.

According to Gronlund, the grant will be used to complete the Advanced Scientific Laboratory Experiences program for Lewisburg Area High School students. In January 2011, the foundation provided a gift of \$16,420 to the Lewisburg Area School District to launch the important initiative.

"We are so grateful to the Edna M. Sheary Charitable Trust for approving our request," said Gronlund. "Receiving this grant allows the foundation to complete the project. Funding provided by the Green Dragon Foundation will complete the purchasing of important advanced scientific equipment for data collection and analysis. Our high school students now have the much needed resources to receive an enhanced science experience."

"High school instructors have been diligently revising curriculum so all students can successfully meet state standards; in the past two years, LAHS students' scores in science have been among the top 10 in Pennsylvania," added Mr. David Himes, LAHS principal. "This contribution will enhance the science curriculum and purchase critical laboratory equipment."

Recently Added Initiatives:

The Link Crew Program at LAHS

In Link Crew, juniors and seniors provide leadership and support for all freshmen to ease their transition to high school. Link Crew leaders provide an interactive and powerful orientation on the first day of school to build a sense of connection and peer support for ninth-graders. Follow-up activities throughout the school year provide opportunities for Link Crew leaders and freshmen to connect both inside and outside the classroom.

iPad Initiative

The purchase of iPads for our students would provide several benefits for teaching and learning. Students can use the devices as e-readers, with hundreds of books—many free—available for download. iPads can provide easy access to online materials available from textbook companies. The portability of iPads makes them ideal for small-group work, as students can easily share the devices. With thousands of applications, teachers may pick and choose to match different student learning styles and provide more opportunities for students to preview, review and reinforce skills and concepts learned in class.

Updating the LAHS Technology Lab

The technology department at Lewisburg Area High School offers a wide range of courses designed to provide students with real-world experiences, including using computers and software to program machines to accomplish complex tasks. However, over the past 20 years, the Computer Numerically Controlled equipment and Robotics Station have become outdated, making it increasingly difficult to program equipment with newer computer operating systems. As a result, students are no longer receiving a real-world experience.

The purchase/replacement of the following items would greatly enhance the program:

- Robotics workstation
- CNC router
- Three-dimensional printer

Budget Crisis Response Initiatives

Due to the drastic reduction in state funding, LASD faces several years of deficits that will require elimination of programs, along with reductions in spending, to balance the budget. In response to this crisis, the Green Dragon Foundation is raising funds to guarantee the following programs will continue:

- Student field trips
- Teacher training/workshops
- Academic student competitions

Kelly Elementary School Inquiry-Based Science Program

The foundation seeks funding for science kits to strengthen early science instruction. The purchase of these pre-made kits would allow teachers to provide learning opportunities that help students explore, hypothesize, question, predict and interpret information in a way that deepens their understanding of the concepts presented in class.

2011 LAHS Distinguished Alumni

Three Distinguished Alumni were recognized during the pre-game show on Alumni Weekend—Edith Erdley, Class of 1930; Jim Bergen, Class of 1969; and Fred Wulczyn, Class of 1971.

Edith Erdley started her education in a one-room school at Route 45 and Fairfield Road. Her career included employment at the U.S. Federal Penitentiary, the Union County Prothonotary's office, the offices of Judge Charles Kalp and attorney Andrew Leiser, and the Lewisburg Trust and Safe Deposit Company, now Sovereign Bank. In addition, she helped on the family farm and managed some of its affairs before selling it in 1986. Edith, whose award was presented posthumously, generously donated much of her estate to

Thanks to the generosity of many donors, fourteen \$1000 scholarships were awarded this spring to seven high school seniors and seven post-high school students. The first scholarship for \$500 was awarded in 1999. After receiving two bequests in 2005, the scholarship program was opened to LAHS post-grads. To date, 94 scholarships totaling \$86,500 have been awarded to 76 students, some of whom received two scholarships—one as a senior and one as a post-graduate.

It is our goal to provide as much financial aid to our students as possible. Jim Bergen has been a math teacher for 35 years at Montoursville High School and the school's football coach for 36 years, serving as head coach from 1987-2010. Under his leadership his teams attained six District IV Championships, 10 League Championships, 19 District playoffs, four State Playoffs, and had three undefeated seasons. His personal accolades include 2005 District IV Coach of the Year, inductee at the West Branch Hall of Fame in 2008, PSFCA District Director 1998-2008 and inductee into the Pa. State Football Coaches Hall of Fame.

Fred Wulczyn, a resident of Chicago, IL, has worked with state child welfare agencies from around the country and around the world on improving the performance of child welfare systems. He has testified before Congress on child welfare policy and has served as special advisor to

the Commissioner for Children, Youth and Families for the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. He developed the nation's first proposal to change the federal law limiting the ability of states to design innovative child welfare services, and has been awarded several prestigious awards dealing with his work in child welfare. Fred has a doctorate from the University of Chicago where he is senior research fellow at Chapin Hall.

Twelve Distinguished Alumni recipients took part in high school classroom discussions during the school day on Friday, Sept. 30. The objective was to have alumni share their real life experiences with students and to facilitate an interchange of ideas. The Distinguished Alumni were able to confirm the students are getting the same quality education that has been the tradition and expectation of the Lewisburg Area School District.

During the summer of 2011, the Lewisburg Green Dragons Sports Boosters experienced their very own “Extreme Makeover,” courtesy of soon-to-be-Eagle Scout, **Wesley Sigl**.

Wesley, a Lewisburg Area High School junior, took on a complete renovation of the baseball/soccer field concession trailer. The stand was falling apart and in need of repair: rickety steps were full of splinters; the interior was disorganized and dingy; and a faulty lock allowed people to break in and steal food.

Wesley enlisted the help of mentor/handyman Brad Jordan, family and fellow boy scouts from Troup 538; over 300 man-hours later, the stand is completely transformed. Wesley obtained over \$1600 in donations from local businesses: Lewisburg Builder’s Supply donated lumber and nails; Gary Newcomer provided a marine-grade counter-top; Carpetman in Milton gave carpeting; and Northway Industries donated new cabinetry in honor of a special employee, C. Kenneth Batram.

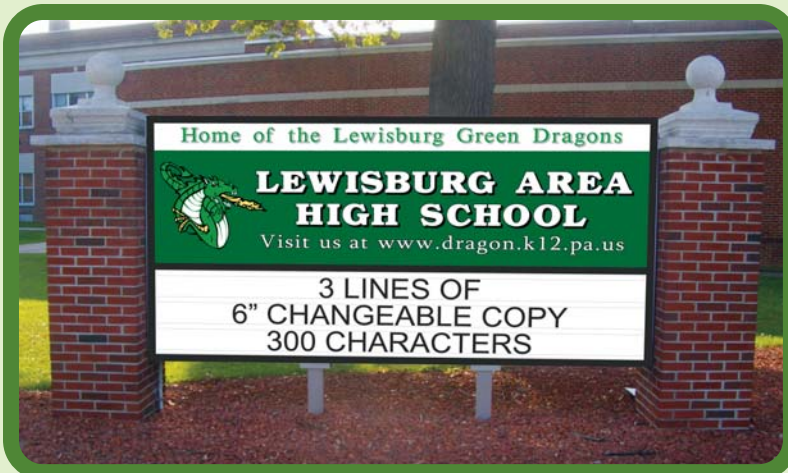

GardenGrove is a new custom themed playground designed specifically to fit Kelly Elementary School's play space.



For years, the Elementary PSA has worked hard to provide the staff at Kelly/Linntown with much needed resources, and this fall will be no exception. This month we will vote on a grant for a software application that works with our whiteboards and is more interactive and user-friendly. The grant is \$14,725 and will benefit students in Grades K-3.

ActivInspire is the educational software that powers the ActivClassroom. The program allows teachers to lead the class via an interactive, multi-media whiteboard, support group collaboration and teamwork in the classroom through Promethean's award-winning Learner Response Systems, and create differentiated lessons filled with rich, powerful activities to grab the attention of the whole class. It features two different interfaces—bright and inviting for

young learners and more sophisticated for older students.

ActivInspire gives teachers the ability to blend real-time, real-world experience with the learning process while using sound, motion and visually engaging graphics to bring lessons to life. Advanced pen and multi-touch capability allows teachers to go beyond the flipchart and interact with the page by zooming, rotating, moving, resizing and interacting with real world tools.

Teachers in Grades K-5 are receiving **grants for \$125** to help purchase items for their classrooms that the regular budget cannot cover. We are pleased to offer these grants and will try to continue to provide them in the future.

Donald H. Eichhorn Middle School has been an eventful place this school year. The excitement continues as a new principal takes over the helm. **Mr. George Drozin**, who grew up in Lewisburg, arrived this summer from New Hampshire and is excited to be back. Mr. Drozin has worked in public education since 1990, exclusively in middle schools since 1995. For the past seven years, he was an administrator in a rural K-8 school of about 450 students that became one of the top performing schools in the state. Mr. Drozin hopes to use his experience to help keep Lewisburg among the elite school districts in Pennsylvania. We welcome you back, Mr. Drozin!

Under Mr. Drozin's direction, the school-wide positive behavior program (SPARRR) continues to grow and retain its value. The first major reward for students (Dragon Stars) in the first marking period was the Fall Festival. This program is supplemented by the sale of the "LBG/DRAGON" t-shirts available in the front office for \$10 (you've seen them around town and at the football games!). New this year is a sport cinch bag, as well as long sleeve t-shirts and sweat-shirts. Call Mrs. Musser to place your orders (570-523-3220).

The fall **Scholastic Book Fair** was held to benefit Related Arts, which supports special guests, including authors and artists, who speak to the students, as well as music and art supplies that aren't covered in the school budget.

The **foreign language department** continues to grow. Sixth graders will take both French and Spanish to be exposed to both foreign languages, allowing them to make a more informed decision for 7th grade.

The community may hear the chorus singing and the band striking up a tune as the **music department** continues to flourish. Under the direction of Mr. Dale Orris, over 151 students are participating in Prep Band (6th grade) and Advanced Band (7th & 8th grades). The Advanced Band members will perform a special Veteran's Day program at a

local nursing home in November. The chorus also is growing, with approximately 115 students singing in unison. The 8th grade music class, under the direction of Mrs. Lynne Berg, plans a trip to NYC to see a Broadway show in the fall and spring as the culmination of their first unit of study, American Theatre.
